What I am about to write may seem silly. And to many, it may appear to be a very simple life adjustment. But when Cindy and I moved to central North Carolina from the Hampton Roads area; we had to adjust to the many streets that had no streetlights. Driving to the church through the country with only our headlights to guide us was different. Cindy was raised in the country. However, I was raised under the ever-present streetlights of Wilmington for most of my life. Why would I begin this newsletter talking about streetlights? Have you ever considered the life of Joseph? He was a very prominent personality leading up to that first Christmas, the birth of Jesus Christ. But then he seems to go behind the curtain in the stage of life. When Joseph closed his carpentry shop to travel to Bethlehem, he and Mary would not find any streetlights to guide their weeklong journey. Depending on the road they took, the trip would cover approximately 70 or 90 miles. One road would take them through Samaria, but the other option would be longer and more treacherous. As this month of thanksgiving has concluded, we are reminded of how much we have to be thankful for and how so very important it is to have an attitude of gratitude. Let us be certain that we have meditated on the greatest and most important Person we have to be thankful for. Grigore once made a decision for Christ, but has not lived a consistent Christian life since. Pray the Lord will convict Grigore to get right with God, and pray for the salvation of Victoria.

Please pray as we have begun working on the foyer of the church. In order for the building to be up to code and have official documentation, we must have a front foyer. This work has been going on for a few months—all being done voluntarily by a few brothers in the church. We are so thankful for those being willing to give of themselves and their time (full days) weeks). It truly is a sacrifice for them and their families. Pray for safety as the work continues. We have the funds for the roof and windows, and we are planning to get them put on this winter. In the spring, we hope to be able to do the stucco exterior (approximately \$10,000) and the parking lot. If the Lord puts it on your heart to contribute to this, it would be a great blessing as we still need funds to complete it. Any contributions can be earmarked - durchowstruction.

Are you aware how God has blessed TWR this year? Let me share just a few areas and ways I have been contributing recently.

Financial giving by folks like you has reached new highs. It has funded tower maintenance projects as well as new areas of outreach. Women of Hope is creating new programming to reach women in the Arab world. There has been a recent distribution of radios to the Pygmies of Central Africa. "I thank the Lord for these gifts," says Bernadette, a villager in Gabon. "I receive these gifts with a heart open to the gospel of Jesus Christ... I thank the Lord for those who brought us these radios to listen to the word of life that transforms hearts." Every Man a Warrior continues to grow in small group studies throughout the US and abroad. The Spanish ministry reported on the impact of programs to Spanish speaking prison


inmates across America. In Cary, God is gracious to provide some large building maintenance at cost because the contractors believe in what TWR is doing.

I read recently that 86% of email is not legitimate, and that spam costs over \$700 per user each year. That is cheap when you consider sneaky requests for funds to which trusting Christians are ready to give. Part of what I have worked on these last few months includes improving email filtration to all our missionaries, so they receive only the right stuff. Additionally, training we received has equipped us to better secure our data from even unintentional leaks. Email and data protection are never-ending jobs. But it is good to know I contribute to the welfare and effectiveness of our missionaries.
