\*Would you please let the young people know if you are joining them for lunch? It helps them prepare the food and tables. A sign-up sheet is in the foyer. Thank-you!



Four years ago, the Lord led Brother Dale and Julie McCoy to the Asheboro church in a "Revitalization" project with the NC Missions Board. The Mission Board extends a heartfelt THANK YOU for partnering in prayer and financial support. Our commitment with them has ended April 1 of 2022. The church has grown numerically and spiritually. Praise the Lord for blessing this dear church. Brother Dale was diagnosed with terminal cancer and passed away in February. The Glad Tidings Church has called Mark (and Cassie) Cahoon as their pastor. The Board is very grateful for your support in making this endeavor a great success! The Missions Board hired Brandon Smith, (July 1, 2021) and Jonathan Huff (September) to head up Project Hickory and plant a Free Will Baptist church in Hickory, NC. Project Hickory is currently at 70% of their monthly faith promise commitments. They are continuing to travel the state to raise the rest of their monthly funds as well as their start-up fund of \$100,000.
