Motions Wednesday, July 27, 2022

Pastor Jones and the leadership team would like to bring before the White Oak Hill church family the following recommendations:

Motion #1: The Pastor and leadership team recommends the church approve the:

a) White Oak Hill FWB Church 2nd Quarter and Semi-Annual Budget Reports for 2022

b) Bailey Christian Childcare 2nd Quarter and Semi-Annual Budget Report for 2022

*According to the church bylaws, this motion will require a 51% approval vote by the church membership present at the business meeting.

Motion #2: The Pastor and White Oak Hill Church leadership team recommends the church hire Brother Jonathan Price to continue his internship at the church as he continues to attend Southeastern Bible College the upcoming school year. If this motion is approved, his responsibilities will be to continue teaching the teens, lead in children's church, help with the music program, and assist the pastor wherever needed (e.g., youth program, BCC). Jonathan would work Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. each day with a compensation of \$250.00 a week.

*According to the church bylaws, this motion will require a 2/3 approval vote by the church membership present at the business meeting.

Motion #3: The Pastor and leadership team recommends the church increase Glenda Carroll's hourly pay rate from \$14.50 to \$16.50 an hour. This requested merit raise is based upon her excellent work and increased workload in helping the Pastor with the administration of Bailey Christian Childcare. If this motion is approved, this increase in hourly wages would begin August 1, 2022.

*According to the church bylaws, this motion will require a 2/3 approval vote by the church membership present at the business meeting.

Over one hundred guests attended the ribbon cutting ceremony for our maternity home, Honeysuckle Studios, a ministry of the **Hope Center**. Speakers for the event included CEO of Family Ministries, Jim McComas, U.S. Representative, Diana Harshbarger, Advisory Board President, Bob Gay, and CEO of the Greene County Partnership. Jeff Taylor.

Honeysuckle Studios will be a haven for young mothers to be able to learn life and parenting skills and strengthen support networks so that they will be able to progress toward self-sufficiency. The goals are tailored to individual strengths and obstacles, and identify specific steps a woman will take to have a healthy pregnancy, become proficient in parenting skills, complete or continue her education, obtain employment and childcare, and move into viable long-term housing. Residents may enter the program during any stage of pregnancy and stay in the program for up to 18 months. Honeysuckle Studios will house up to five, single pregnant women, with each woman having their own efficiency style apartment.

We respect each individual's personal journey and their history, preserving their dignity and humanity - meeting people where they are.


