

Dear Friends,

In Brazil, we planned a hike with our volunteers to Pedra do
Telégrafo so we could invite Israeli backpackers to hike with us and talk
with them about the gospel. There was just one problem: our volunteers
invited countless Israelis to join us with no success. The morning of the
hike we woke up very early to head out, and we were surprised when
Igal\* texted us about 10 minutes before we left for the hike. He was an
Israeli staying in Rio de Janeiro, and he wanted to come with us. We were
overjoyed at this last-minute addition to our group, and we would soon



When Igal met me, he exclaimed, "I hear you believe in Jesus, and you're Jewish." This was exciting and interesting to him! It turns out that on the one-hour drive to the hike, one of our Israeli volunteers who believes in Jesus explained to him the basics of what we believe. On the hike, we were able to get to know him more and talk more about faith. Igal is a philosophy major at an Israeli university and he recently concluded that God exists after being an atheist for years. Now he was on a journey to figure out what he believes about God. His assumption was that the God of Israel must be the true God. That assumption led us to talk with him about the promised Messiah of Israel who is Jesus.

Our conversations with Igal continued when he came to stay at our guesthouse for two nights. On Sunday morning during breakfast, Igal asked us a question that sparked a two-hour conversation about salvation by works vs. salvation by grace. We could see the wheels turning in his brain as he considered that salvation is not based on anything that we do but that we obey God because He changes our hearts. This was mind-boggling to him!

Igal seemed so close to believing in Jesus! Also, he thinks so philosophically that I could see him leading many others like him to Messiah if he does come to faith. We are planning to visit him when we go to Israel next month. Pray that God continues to work in Igal's life and that he comes to faith. Pray that he would experience the salvation by grace through faith that we talked with him about.
