Hopefully, we are getting closer to being able to offer all-day care for the parents. Despite our best efforts, the building inspector is requiring the church to install a door leading to the outside of the K-4 classroom. Classrooms for this age group must have two ways to exit a room in case of a fire. Because this modification is a permanent change to the building, the Leadership Team would like the church's permission at the next business meeting to proceed. The church family will vote on the matter at the next business meeting. I know the church has been very patient with the process of getting the daycare operational. Thank you for your patience. This process has been very difficult and very expensive. But what isn't expensive these days? Due to the cost of the improvements to the church, the length of time it has taken, and the needed changes in the future; the daycare needs some money in its account. The Leadership team would like to use your gifts at Homecoming to strengthen the bank account for Bailey Christian Daycare. I hope you will be generous and help the church get the daycare fully operational. And I hope you understand the government's hurdles and the challenges we have faced so far. But we know this is what the Lord has led our church to build. We will not give up! Families in our area are depending on us. Let's make this happen! Please pray how you can help financially this Homecoming.

Learning Hebrew is hard, but I (Jenna) didn't expect to feel overwhelmed to the point of tears on the third day of class. My desire to learn Hebrew started feeling like an impossible task, but the words from a prayer in *Liturgies and Laments for the Sojourner* comforted me. An excerpt from the prayer says, "Sustain us in our language learning journey. Help us to speak the language of the people among whom we dwell, so that we might grow closer in our relationships with



others. Give us the posture of humility, as we ask for help and seek to understand. May we die to self and realize our complete dependence on You." By God's grace I have completed Aleph, the first level of Hebrew. Please continue to pray for us as we study this wonderful language.

During my class, I met several Jewish people with whom I was able to share my faith. One of those people was Caroline,* a Jewish woman I met one day after class. My friend Cat and I were working on homework, and Caroline started talking with us. The conversation was light, and Cat was able to share that she is a Jewish believer in Jesus. Suddenly Caroline began discussing divisive social issues about which we as believers do not agree with her, and we quietly listened until I felt the Spirit nudge me to speak about God's holiness and His desire for us to be holy. She politely listened and then left to do her own homework. Please pray Caroline's heart will be softened and she'll come to know God's desire to make her holy like He is holy.

Please also pray that Dana,* another student in my class, will come to know her Jewish Messiah as well. I've been able to share part of my testimony with her and talk about the rest I've received through my relationship with God. When I first brought up that I believe in Jesus, she seemed uncomfortable, but she has continued to speak with me. I'm hoping to continue sharing my faith with her.

Thank you for praying for us as we continue to love the Jewish people and share the hope of Jesus with them.
