This past June I received an email from Samaritan's Purse giving the results of the Operation Christmas Child Campaign last year. Our church's effort to be a part of this year's shoebox collection is well underway. Let me share a portion of the email I received in June.

We praise God for your partnership in the Gospel in 2022. In the United States, we collected 9.3 Million shoebox gifts last year, and 19,432 of those came from right here in our 6 counties of the Coastal Plain NC Area Team.

Our theme verse across the Carolinas for the year ahead is Ephesians 3:20-21, which states, "Now to him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is at work within us, to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, for ever and ever! Amen."

We chose this verse because we have seen God do Immeasurably More in our lives, our Area Team and around the world through Operation Christmas Child! Today, we would like to invite you to join us as we praise Him for all the ways He is using simple shoebox gifts to change lives and communities worldwide.

Please join us as we go BEYOND THE BOX. We will share details about the amazing impact of the ministry and different ways you can deepen your commitment to sharing the Gospel to the ends of the earth this year.

Last year tens of thousands of children gave their life to Christ through the impactful program of Operation Christmas Child. Let me encourage everyone to brighten a child's Christmas and give them the opportunity to hear the Gospel. Thus far our church has collected 121 shoeboxes. Let me encourage every reader to join us as we go "BEYOND THE BOX." Each of us can make a difference. Here's how.

- Take a shoebox from the display in the foyer.
- Fill the shoebox with some of the suggested items already provided for the appropriate age group. (I normally get mine at the Dollar Tree).
- Give just \$10 to help Samaritans Purse ship the shoeboxes around the world.
- The shoebox deadline is November 12th. This way the gifts can reach the children prior to Christmas.



### CADIE COX REFLECTS ON HER CMP EXPERIENCE IN FRANCE

Walking into the unknown for Christ was exciting and terrifying all at the same time! On June 5, 2023, I boarded a plane by myself and flew halfway across the world from Arkansas to Nantes, France, to spend a month with David, Myriam (Mimi), and Jade Reeves, missionaries at the Saint-Sébastien Church. Twentyfour hours later, I arrived at my destination. I was welcomed with a sweet note written by my host family—the Reeves—that included this quote from ion Keith-Falconer, "I have but one candle of light to burn, and I would rather burn it out in a



God is doing amazing things in France, and it was life-changing to experience! Mimi and David explained to me that France is a broken and dark country. That is exactly what I witnessed, a place that has no desire to know God. Therefore, a majority of my time in France was spent doing outreach events and having impactful conversations with people. We conducted English nights, Connexion Kidz events, and basically talked to anyone we met. My favorite memory was the English night we threw to celebrate the Fourth of July. Mimi and I spent almost two days preparing all the food and getting their house ready to host around 50 believers and non-believers. During that night, we played American games and had conversations in hopes of forming relationships so that we could invite new people to church, other outreach events, and share the gospel. It was a success; the next day five new people came to church!

My life will forever be impacted because of CMP. God has taught me He can use a broken person to reach broken people. I realized being



a missionary doesn't require anything special, just a desire to be obedient to God's plan. This was evident in the missionarles on the field as they are all human and deal with similar difficulties that I face every day. In addition, I learned that there are people in all parts of the world searching for hope. I was able to converse with people who did not have a relationship with God, but were searching for answers and hope that only He could provide. I wasn't sure what to expect in France, but God orchestrated plans better than I could have ever imagined.

God provided me with the opportunity to do CMP France for a reason. It was an unbelievable experience that helped me use my outgoing personality to thrive and taught me to be more intentional with my actions and words by sharing the love of Jesus with everyone I meet no matter where I am.

Isaiah 6:8 states, "Whom shall I send? And who will go for us?" And I said, "Here I am. Send me!" I want to encourage high school and college students to GO! If you are scared, do it anyway! If you are unsure, show up anyway! If you feel unprepared, go anyway! Apply for CMP (or ETEAM) as this significantly changed my life and outlook towards missions. I met extraordinary missionaries in France who have an incredible desire to serve the Lord in every capacity of their life. Everything I was a part of had a purpose and was for a purpose greater than myself. Spending a month working with the Reeves in France, ignited my interest in international missions and my passion for working with people searching for hope.
